Thurston PUD Commissioners will hold Public Hearings on the proposed 2017 budget, utility rates and capital surcharges. Hearings are scheduled on September 12th and September 27th, and if needed on October 3rd. The Commissioners are planning to adopt the 2017 budget and utility rates and consider capital surcharge revisions on

September 27th following a Public Hearing. Members of the public are welcome to attend these meetings. Written comments received by close of business September 23rd will become part of the public record. The Board will hear, read and discuss your comments. The Board is required to adopt or modify the budget no later than October 3, 2016, but plans to adopt rates, the budget and capital surcharges for 2017 rates on September 27, 2016.

Update on PUD's Capital Improvement Plan, 2017-2021

In 2014, the PUD had community meetings in Thurston, Lewis and Pierce counties to engage our customers in a discussion on how to best prepare for and fund capital improvements necessary in the coming years. After receiving public input, the Board of Commissioners made a decision to pay for ongoing operations and maintenance costs from rates and to pay for capital improvements and replacements from capital surcharges. The infrastructure of each system is unique to each water system of the PUD's 160 water systems, but generally, infrastructure refers to the wells, pumps, water mains, pump houses, booster pumps, service lines, water meters, reservoirs, treatment systems, electrical systems, and other associated equipment.

Capital surcharges are used to fund system replacement at the end of an asset's life cycle. We developed and use an integrated asset management system to estimate when things need to be replaced. A capital surcharge of \$1.00 per month per home, or per equivalent residential unit for other facilities, was implemented beginning January 1, 2015. In 2016, this surcharge increased to \$2.90, and it is projected to increase to \$4.80 on January 1, 2017. The PUD made a commitment to you that we will be good shepherds of these monies you pay as surcharges and only use them for infrastructure replacement. The projected capital surcharges per month, for the next few years, are listed below:

Based on the replacement schedule in the asset management plan (AMP), our capital improvement plan (CIP) spending funded by surcharges for the next five years is outlined below:

A summary of these projected CIP expenditures, for the years 2017 – 2021, by category, follows the article in this newsletter. We have not used any of the capital surcharge funds to replace infrastructure so far. We have been using other PUD capital funding for replacements and allowing surcharge monies to accumulate. The capital surcharge account has <u>\$111,713.96</u> in it as of August 8, 2016, and we expect to begin using these monies at the beginning of 2017.

Water Leaks

As we try to be proactive on water leaks, one of Thurston PUD's procedures is to review high consumption meter reads on a monthly basis to determine if a customer has a leak. It can be challenging to determine if there is a leak from reviewing meter read numbers during the summer months. You may receive a phone call or letter from our office to notify you of increased consumption. A high meter read may indicate that a hose or spigot may have been left running, that you've been doing extra watering, or there's a water leak.

If you think you might have a leak, the way to check is outlined below:

- 1. Shut off all the water inside
- 2. Find your water meter (usually on the front part of one of your property lines).
- 3. Look at the face of the meter, there will be a triangle or circle that turns if water is running through the meter. If the dial is turning, you have a leak. If you don't see anything moving, take a meter read and wait 10 or 15 minutes and take another meter read.

If you determine that there's a leak at your property, you can try to find and fix the leak yourself, or you can call a plumber. If the leak is fixed and our office is notified by phone call within 10 days of the date we notify you about the possible leak/high consumption, you may be eligible for a leak adjustment.
